

AMPHOTERICIN B (as liposomal injection)

Amfoe-ter-a-sin

What does it do?

Amphotericin is used to treat and prevent fungal infections.

Before you start

- Tell your doctor if you have liver or kidney problems.
- Tell your doctor if you are pregnant, planning to become pregnant, or breastfeeding.

How is it given?

Amphotericin is given as an infusion into a vein.

Can you take other medicines?

Tell your pharmacist or doctor about <u>all medicines or treatments</u> that you may be taking, including vitamins, herbal products or recreational drugs.

What side effects might you notice?

| Side Effects | Recommended action |
|--|---------------------------------|
| Reaction during the infusion including: fever, chills, aches and pains Symptoms of liver problems including: yellow skin or eyes, itching, dark urine, pale bowel motions, abdominal pain Reduced number of blood cells that fight infections or help your blood to dot - symptoms include: fever, chills, sore throat or generally feeling unwell, or easy or unusual bruising or bleeding Chest pain | Tell your doctor immediately |
| Changes in heartbeat, muscle cramps or weakness Tiredness, dizziness, pale skin | Tell your doctor |
| Nausea, vomiting, diarrhoea | Tell your doctor if troublesome |

If you notice any other effects, discuss them with your doctor or pharmacist.

Other information:

 You will need regular blood tests while taking amphoteric to checkif it is causing problems with your liver, kidneys, or the amount of potassium in your blood.
